

## The 2010 Three Sisters Rally Challenge for Drivers and Co-Drivers.

### Regulations.

1. Blackpool South Shore Motor Club, Wigan & District Motor Club, and High Moor Motor Club will co-promote the above Rally Challenge in accordance with the General Regulations of RAC the Motor Sports Association United Kingdom, (Incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), and these Rally Challenge 2010 Regulations.
2. The Three Sisters Rally Challenge will consist of all three Special Stage Rallies organised by the above clubs, at The Three Sisters Race Circuit, Ashton in Makerfield, Nr. Wigan, Lancashire.
3. The Rally Challenge is open to all members of the organising clubs, plus ANCC, ANWCC. The championship registration number is 29/2010.
4. The Three Special Stage Rallies will take place on these dates, The Roskirk Stages Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> March 2010, The Procure Stages Sunday 2nd May 2010, and The Keith A. Wood Stages Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> October 2010. Each rally will be held on sealed asphalt surfaces.
5. To qualify for any trophies or cash awards Drivers & Co-Drivers will need to enter all the three rallies.
6. Drivers and Co-Drivers do not need to register for The Rally Challenge.
7. To be The Three Sisters Rally Challenge Driver or Co-Driver you must finish all three rallies.
8. The results will appear on [www.wigan-motor-club.org.uk](http://www.wigan-motor-club.org.uk) web site after each rally.
9. The eligibility Scrutineer is Mr. Chris Mansley MSA National A.
10. The five classes for The Three Sisters Rally Challenge will be:-
  - A. Cars with engines up to 1000cc.
  - B. Cars with engines 1001cc - 1400cc.
  - C. Cars with engines 1401cc – 1600cc.
  - D. Cars with engines 1601cc - 2000cc.
  - E. Cars with engines 2001cc and over.

**N.B.** Engine capacities will be actual capacities. Cars with forced induction and rotary engine cars, regulation **R 48.2.4**, will apply and have their engine capacities multiplied by 1.7 to determine their class. All vehicles must comply with M.S.A. Technical Regulations for special stage rallies with due attention to **R 46 - R 48.10.10**.

**Turbo anti-lag systems must be disconnected to comply with the circuit requirements.**

11. There are no entry fees for participating in The Three Sisters Rally Challenge the first event is in March. The onus is on the competitors to get their entries in early to avoid any disappointment.
12. Class winners will be actual class winners excluding overall placings, £15 will be awarded to every class winning Driver & Co-Driver in each of the three Special Stage Rallies, subject to a minimum number of cars in each class, as published in each of the rallies regulations.
13. The Driver & Co-Driver of Three Sisters Rally Challenge will be presented with perpetual awards plus replicas to the Driver & Co-Driver. These will be awarded to the Driver & Co-Driver with the lowest number of points; one point is awarded for each overall place.
14. If you do not finish some of the rallies i.e. you receive a D.N.F. you will drop to the bottom of the leader board.
15. In the event of a tie for the overall placings regulation R15.2.2 will apply with respect to The Three Sisters Rally Challenge.
16. The Three Sisters Rally Challenge stewards are Brian Sykes, Gerry Morriss and David Hind.
